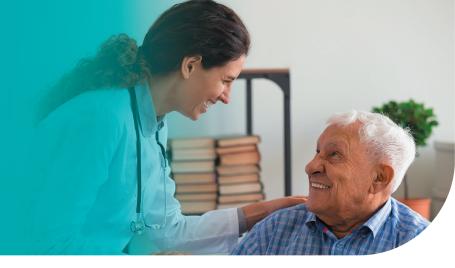

Emergency Room vs. Urgent Care

Do you know when to visit an Urgent Care Center? Urgent care centers treat medical problems that can't wait until your next Primary Care Provider (PCP) visit. If it is a life-threatening problem go to the Emergency Room (ER). Urgent care centers can see you on a walk-in basis. Many are open evenings and weekends. Waiting time is shorter than in the ER.

Urgent Care

Use for conditions such as:

- Muscle strains
- Minor cuts/burns
- Earache
- Rashes
- Fever
- Sore throat, cough or running nose

- General wound care
- Animal bite
- Flu Screening
- Mild asthma
- Urinary tract infection

Emergency Room*

Use for sudden injury or sickness such as:

- A lot of bleeding
- A very bad burn
- Drug overdose
- Gunshot wound
- Very bad shortness of breath (trouble breathing)
- Chest pain
- Broken bones
- Stroke
